An archaeological excavation took place here in the 1970s before much of the area was flooded by the reservoir. As a result of this, we have very thorough information on the sites, and many of the monuments have been reconstructed so that visitors can really appreciate how they might have looked thousands of years ago. The trail offers visitors an unparalleled opportunity to experience these dramatic sites, and to gain insights into the lives and deaths of our ancestors.

Lleolir Llwybr Archeolegol Brenig ar lannau gogleddol Llyn Brenig. Mae'n cyrraedd y tir uchel lle mae golygfeydd godidog dros Hiraethog i Eryri. Mae archeoleg yr ardal yn gyfoethog. Mae yma fan claddu o'r Oes Efydd yn ogystal ag olion adeiladau o'r Oesoedd Canol ymlaen.

Brenig Archaeological Trail is located on the northern shores of Llyn Brenig, extending up onto the high ground with stunning views across Hiraethog to Snowdonia. The area is rich in archaeology, being the location of a Bronze Age burial ground, as well as containing the remains of buildings from the Middle Ages onwards.
